REPUBLICANS AIM TO CUT STATE SPENDING

Skyrocketing inflation, rising interest rates, crippling energy costs, and record-high gas prices, caused by reckless policies being pushed by Democrats at the federal level, are crushing Arizonans' ability to have discretionary income. The current housing market is also playing a role. As a result, many of our citizens are struggling to pay for basic necessities, and they're spending much less than they normally would, limiting the tax revenues our state is able to generate. Consequently, we learned this week that the state will experience a budget shortfall of \$400 million in FY2024 and potentially \$450 million in FY2025. Republican lawmakers will evaluate a variety of ways to cut spending in order to accommodate this shortfall and return to a balanced budget. What won't be on the chopping block is our school choice program, which saves the state roughly \$6000 per child enrolled.




