REPUBLICANS PROPOSE TEACHER PAY RAISES

Last session, we provided inflationary relief to families with the Arizona Families Tax Rebate, as well as to tenants by eliminating the tenantpaid rental tax. In 2024, we'll remain laser-focused on tackling inflation by addressing gas prices, housing costs, and teacher pay raises. This week, we announced the "Teacher Pay Fund," a plan the Republicancontrolled Legislature will send to the ballot next November to provide K-12 public school teachers with raises averaging 7%, or approximately \$4000. This will be done without a tax increase. The dedicated funding source for this will be the Land Trust Endowment, which is constitutionally protected for education spending only. This fund has grown exponentially over the years and is projected to continue to grow. We want to ensure our kids receive a great education and a quality teacher in every classroom. This is a step in the right direction. -President Warren Peterser
